REGISTRATION NOW OPEN!!!

Thursday, 12 September 2024 Delano Day! On the *Tennessee Valley Railroad*

Departing from Delano, Tennessee at 1:30 PM, returning at 5:00 PM. Enjoy a 50mile roundtrip through the beautiful lower Hiwassee River gorge. This 4-hour round trip takes you to the top of the famous Hiwassee Loop, where the tracks cross over themselves as they corkscrew up the mountain near Farner, Tennessee. There are only 6 of these loops in North America and this is the only one East of the Mississippi River.

- Snacks and souvenirs are available for purchase on the train, including drinks, chips, candy, t-shirts, caps, and books.
- Trains have enclosed, climate-controlled cars pulled by a diesel locomotive and restrooms on each car.
- Parking is located at **9406** Hwy **411**, **Delano**, **TN 37325** (near the Hiwassee/Ocoee Scenic River State Park ranger office).
- Please arrive 30 minutes before departure time. Delano, Tennessee, is located in the Eastern Time Zone (EDT).

If you'd like to incorporate Chattanooga as part of your trip, we can arrange for a 9:45 AM departure on the 65-minute roundtrip Missionary Ridge Local ride that travels to the East Chattanooga Depot where the Soule Shop is located and you can receive a tour of the Soule restoration shop. The trip starts at the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum: Robert Murray Soule, Jr., was the founding member and President of the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum. Under his tutelage, the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum became the largest operating railroad museum know *immediately* the Southeast United Becket in States. (The Biltmore House is a Châteauesque-style mansion built for George Washington Vanderbilt II, the youngest son of an American family famous for its wealth, between 1889 and 1895 and is the largest privately owned house in the United States, at 178,926 ft² of floor space and 135,280 ft² of living area. Still owned by George's descendants, it remains one of the most prominent examples of Gilded Age

architecture. George Vanderbilt's guests marveled at the magnificent residence containing 34 bedrooms, 43 bathrooms, and 65 fireplaces covering four acres of floor space. Vanderbilt traveled the world to furnish his

home: art by Renoir, Whistler, and Sargent; exquisite 16th-century tapestries; and 24,000 books in seven languages. This afternoon you can visit more than 60 rooms carefully preserved by Vanderbilt's descendants, rooms appearing as they did a century ago.)

Delano Drinks

We don't advocate the consumption of alcoholic beverages...except for medicinal purposes or historical research. Many DELANOS have been known to appreciate an occasional libation. **FDR's** favorite was the **Dry Martini**, but contrary to James Bond of 007 fame he was not particular about whether it was "shaken not stirred." FDR was also not particular about the garnish that accompanied the drink. An olive or a lemon peel or both for that matter was all right with him. It was said that when he made them himself aboard the Presidential Yacht he would use whatever was available resulting in some rather innovative accompaniments.

In September of 1998 at a mini-reunion hosted by **Cousins Sara and Tom Kelly**, **Cousin Juan Pablo Delano Tellechea** introduced us to the Pisco Sour, made from the famed Peruvian **Pisco Brandy**. We are told that sour is a favorite drink in Chile as well as Peru, though made differently in each country.

We have understood from **Cousin John Osborne** that Pesco Brandy was known in San Francisco in the 1850's. The brandy, made from native Peruvian Quebranta grapes, took its name from the port from which it was shipped. The famed Bank Exchange Bar in the Montgomery Block building gained an international reputation for its **Pesco Punch**. To one reporter of that day "the invention of Pisco Punch did more to advance civilization than the driving of the Golden Spike." We wonder if **Alonzo Delano** of literary fame (see NL# 29 pg. 1 Dec. 1998) ever encountered the drink while he was in the wholesale grocery business in San Francisco in those days?

The renowned **Captain Amasa Delano**, while in the port of Fredericksburg, VA in the late 1700's introduced the **Rum Swizzle** (frothed rum, water, ice, and bitters) to an acquaintance visiting from the College of William & Mary. It was Amasa's favorite drink at the time (see NL#31 pg. 10, June-Sept. 1999).

Now, thanks to the eagle eye of **Cousin Ernie Towers**, comes the **DELANO Ciapirinha**, recognized in the January 2002 issue of *Bon Appetite* (pg. 82) as "one of the two best drinks of the year." The **DELANO Ciapirinha** is named after the famed Delano Hotel in Miami Beach (and now Las Vegas) and is made from Cachaça, limes, fresh lemon and lime juices, sugar, and Ice. We thank Cousins Ernie and John for research on this subject.


